


What

- Entirely water-based must arrive by boat or air
- Location: Sacramento River Delta, near Stockton, CA
- Minimum viable seastead: rented houseboats rafted up together





- Insurance costs too high: \$300/ person
- TSI turned over control to community
- Community developed ever since



2012: Winds of Change

- First year to break up into islands with separate leadership
- 40 knot / 46 mph winds
- Islands broke apart and began drifting into each other

Lessons learned

- Better anchors
- Better communication (mandatory radios)
- Chain of command
- Better training




